2018 TREE & SHRUB INFORMATION

Conifer Transplants – * *Conifers provide food & shelter for wildlife, nesting sites for many birds & small animals.*

Balsam Fir (*Abies balsamea*): Slow growth rate. Sun/partial shade. Moist well drained soil, prefers cool conditions.

Black Hills Spruce (*Picea glauca densata*): Slow growth rate. Sun/partial shade. Moist well drained soil.

Colorado Blue Spruce (*Picea pungens*): Slow/medium growth rate. Full sun. Well drained soil; tolerates many soil types.

Douglas Fir (*Pseudotsuga menziesii*): Medium growth rate. Sun/partial shade. Moist well drained soil.

Fraser Fir (*Abies fraseri*): Medium growth rate. Sun/partial shade, moist to damp but well drained soils. Not suited for clay soil.

Norway Spruce (*Picea abies*): Medium growth rate. Sun/partial shade. Moist well drained soil; tolerates many soil types.

Red Pine (*Pinus resinosa*): Medium growth rate. Sun, well-drained soil. Makes a good windbreak.

White Cedar (*Thuja occidentalis*): Medium/slow growth rate. Sun/partial shade. Grows best on neutral or slightly alkaline soils, well drained, but not extremely wet or dry sites.

White Pine (*Pinus strobus*) Full sun; can grow 24" per year. Moist well drained soil. Makes a good windbreak.

Deciduous

American Elderberry (*Sambucus canadensis*): Fast growth rate. Sun/light shade. Needs well drained organic soil. It's a myth that they can grow on poorly drained, wet soil. Outstanding food value for wildlife.

Common Lilac (*Syringa vulgaris*): 8-12' leggy, upright shrub. Full sun. Fertile and well drained soil. Nesting for song birds. Fragrant.

Eastern Redbud (*Cercis canadensis*) 20-30' tree, one of the first to flower in spring. Thrives in many soil types.

Red Maple (*Acer rubrum*): Medium fast growth rate. Sun/moist well drained soil. Valuable browse for deer; brilliant red in fall.

River Birch (*Betula nigra*): Medium fast growth rate. Sun/light shade. Soil well drained to wet. Erosion control along streambanks.

Sugar Maple (*Acer saccharum*): Slow growth rate. Sun/partial shade and well drained soils. Sap good source for maple syrup.

Tulip Tree (*Liriodendron tulipifera*): Fast growth rate. Sun/partial shade. Moderately moist, deep, well drained soil. Fragrant.

Tupelo (*Nyssa sylvatica*) Sun/partial shade. Deep, acidic, evenly moist soil. Needs room to grow. Leaves turn shades of red, orange, yellow and purple in fall.

White Oak (*Quercus alba*): Slow/medium growth rate. Sun/well drained soil. Acorns valuable food for wildlife; hard timber.

Fruit

Blackberry (*Rubus darrow*): This plant produces large black fruit that is firm, fleshy, and sweet. Blackberry will produce over a long period of time. It is a very hardy and heavy producer. The root systems of this plant have great soil holding capacity.

Blueberry- Jersey early and mid-July (*Vaccinium*): Vigorous erect bush, medium size, firm, sweet berry. Hardy and drought resistant.

Red Raspberry (*Rubus latham*): 3-5' Dark green foliage on an upright bush, producing bright berries. Bloom time late spring, fruit begins to ripen in midsummer. Full sun required.

Conservation Pacs * Native or Naturalized E-early; M-mid; L-late s-sun; sh-shade

Fern pac: 2 each Christmas, Cinnamon, *Maidenhair, *New York, Ostrich.

Native Flowering pac: 2 each *Black Chokeberry, *Elderberry, *American Cranberry, *Juneberry, *Buffaloberry

Nut Tree pac: 2 each *Chinquapin Oak, *Black Walnut, *Sawtooth Oak, *Red Oak, *Pin Oak

Perennial Flower pac: 2 each (E-M) Dream Baby & Frances Fay Daylily, (E) Blue King & Snow Queen Iris, (L) Autumn Joy Sedum,

OCRRRA Premium Compost: Each bag of compost is 1 cubic foot (approx. 40 lbs.) and is locally produced by OCRRRA.

PLEASE NOTE

- Trees are bare-root stock and sold for conservation purposes only. Sizes subject to change based on availability from the nursery.
- Transplants are seedlings that have been removed from their original seedbed and transplanted to a new bed. Compared to seedlings, transplants have a superior root system, ensuring better survival.
- No refunds will be given for orders not picked up. We recommend that early pick up of stock and same day planting will help ensure survivability. If you can't do this, heel the plants immediately into the ground for a short duration. Storing plants in a bucket of water is not recommended, plants will drown.
- **The District is not responsible for the success or failure of your plantings, nor size of the product.**
