2024 TREE & SHRUB INFORMATION

SOFTWOODS

American larch (*Larix laricina*): 40-80' tall and 15-30' wide. Full sun, moist, well-drained soils. Deciduous needles.

Fraser fir (*Abies fraseri*): 30-50' tall and 10-25' wide. Sun/partial shade, acidic, moist, well drained soils.

Eastern white pine (*Pinus strobus*): 50-80' tall and 20-40' wide. Sun/partial shade, acidic, moist, well drained soils.

HARDWOODS

American hazelnut (*Corylus americana*): 10-16' tall and 8-13' wide. Sun/partial shade, moist, well-drained soil. Edible fruit. Nuts are similar to the European filbert. Various wildlife eat the nuts.

River birch (*Betula nigra*): 40-70' tall and 40-60' wide. Sun/partial shade. Tolerates wet clay soils. Bark of visual interest.

Serviceberry (*Amelanchier laevis*): 15-40' tall and 15-40' wide. Sun/partial shade. Small white flowers. Can tolerate many soil types.

Shagbark hickory (*Carya ovata*): 70-90' tall and 50-70' wide. Sun/partial shade and moist, well-drained soils. Nuts are valuable to wildlife. Bark is habitat for bats.

Bur oak (*Quercus macrocarpa*): 60-80' tall and 60-80' wide. Full sun and dry to moderately wet soils. Acorns of visual interest and good for wildlife.

Swamp white oak (*Quercus bicolor*): 50-60' tall and wide. Sun/wet soil. Acorns valuable food for wildlife; hard timber.

Red maple (*Acer rubrum*): 40-70' tall and 30-50' wide. Sun/partial shade. Can tolerate wet soils. Red fall colors.

Sugar maple (*Acer saccharum*): 60-75' tall and 40-50' wide. Sun/partial shade & well drained soils. Good source for maple syrup.

CONSERVATION PACKS

Bird & Butterfly: 2 each - Buttonbush, elderberry, Liatris spicata, ninebark, Stella de Oro daylily.

Edible Fruit: 2 each - Blackberry, blueberry - Jersey, blueberry - blue ray, raspberry, strawberry.

Evergreen: 2 each - Colorado blue spruce, Fraser fir, white spruce, balsam fir, white pine.

Native Flowering: 2 each - White flowering dogwood, elderberry, serviceberry, red osier dogwood, eastern redbud.

Native NY Wildlife: 2 each - White pine, red osier dogwood, black cherry, hazelnut, serviceberry.

Ornamental Flowering: 2 each - Ninebark, American cranberry, lilac, redbud, white flowering dogwood.

Perennial Flower: 2 each - Dream baby daylily (early-mid), Frances Fay daylily (early-mid), mixed peony (early), snow queen iris (early), Stelle de Oro daylily (early-mid-late).

Pond Habitat: 2 each - Red osier dogwood, buttonbush, sycamore, willow, river birch.

FRUIT

Granny Smith apple: Late season flower. Crisp, tart, juicy. Good for baking. Cross pollinates with Golden Delicious.

Golden Delicious apple: Late season flower. Mild sweet, yellow apple good for baking. Cross pollinates with Granny Smith.

Cortland apple: Mid-season flower. Sweet/tart all-purpose apple. Cross pollinates with McIntosh.

McIntosh apple: Mid-season flower. Juicy, tangy, all-purpose apple. Cross pollinates with Cortland.

American elderberry (*Sambucus canadensis*): 5-12' tall and 5-12' wide. Sun/partial shade. Can tolerate organic-rich wet soils. Edible fruit with wildlife value. Should be pruned regularly.

Raspberry – Latham red: Large easy to pick red fruit. Adapts to a wide range of soil and cold hardy.

Blueberry – Jersey: Self-pollinating but better yields if cross pollinated. Late summer fruiting. Crack resistant.

- Trees are **bare-root stock and sold for conservation purposes only**. Sizes subject to change based on availability from the nursery.
- **No refunds** will be given for orders not picked up. We recommend that early pick up of stock and same day planting will help ensure survivability. If you can't do this, heel the plants immediately into the ground for a short duration. Storing plants in a bucket of water is not recommended.
- **The District will refund orders** for stock that is unavailable and **ONLY IF SUBSTITUTIONS CANNOT BE MADE**.
