2025 TREE & SHRUB INFORMATION

SOFTWOODS

White spruce (*Picea glauca*): 40-60' tall and 10-20' wide. Full sun/partial shade, well-drained soils.

Balsam fir (*Abies balsamea*): 40-75' tall and 15-25' wide. Partial/full shade, moist, well-drained, acidic soils.

Red pine (*Pinus resinosa*): 50-100' tall and 20-40' wide. Full sun, sandy or well-drained soils. Valuable for reforestation projects; drought-tolerant.

Eastern white cedar (*Thuja occidentalis*): 25-40' tall and 10-12' wide. Sun/partial shade, moist, well-drained/wet soils.

Red spruce (*Picea rubens*): 60-80' tall and 30-40' wide. Full sun/partial shade, moist, acidic, well-drained soils; a great replacement for eastern hemlock.

HARDWOODS

Black walnut (*Juglans nigra*): 50-80' tall and wide. Full sun, deep, well-drained soils. Valuable timber and nuts; produces juglone, which can inhibit growth of some plants nearby.

Shagbark hickory (*Carya ovata*): 70-90' tall and 50-70' wide. Sun/partial shade and moist, well-drained soils. Nuts are valuable to wildlife. Bark is habitat for bats.

Bur oak (*Quercus macrocarpa*): 60-80' tall and 60-80' wide. Full sun and dry to moderately wet soils. Good for wildlife.

Swamp white oak (*Quercus bicolor*): 50-60' tall and wide. Sun, wet soil. Acorns valuable food for wildlife; hard timber.

Sugar maple (*Acer saccharum*): 60-75' tall and 40-50' wide. Sun/partial shade & well drained soils. Good source for maple syrup.

White flowering dogwood (*Cornus florida*): 15-30' tall and wide. Small flowering tree. Well-drained soil & full sun.

Tulip poplar (*Liriodendron tulipifera*): 60-75' tall and 40-50' wide. Full sun, rich, moist, well-drained soils. Large flowers.

CONSERVATION PACKS

Bird & Butterfly: 2 each – Black chokeberry, elderberry, liatris spicata, ninebark, apricot beauty daylily.

Edible Fruit: 2 each - Blackberry, blueberry - Jersey, blueberry - blue ray, raspberry, strawberry.

Evergreen: 2 each - Colorado blue spruce, Fraser fir, white spruce, balsam fir, white pine.

Native Flowering: 2 each - White flowering dogwood, elderberry, serviceberry, red osier dogwood, eastern redbud.

Native NY Wildlife: 2 each - White pine, red osier dogwood, black cherry, hazelnut, serviceberry.

Ornamental Flowering: 2 each - Ninebark, American cranberry, lilac, redbud, white flowering dogwood.

Lavendar Pack: 2 each – Fred Boutin, grosso – fat spike, Provence, Munstead, Hidcote

Pond Habitat: 2 each - Red osier dogwood, buttonbush, sycamore, willow, river birch.

Shade Tree: 2 each – Sycamore, red maple, hybrid poplar, silver maple, red oak

FRUIT

Honeycrisp apple: Mid-season flower. Sweet/tart flavor, crisp texture. Cross pollinates with McIntosh.

Cortland apple: Mid-season flower. Sweet/tart all-purpose apple. Cross pollinates with McIntosh.

American elderberry (*Sambucus canadensis*): 5-12' tall and 5-12' wide. Sun/partial shade. Can tolerate organic-rich wet soils. Edible fruit with wildlife value. Should be pruned regularly.

Blueberry – Jersey: Self-pollinating but better yields if cross pollinated. Late summer fruiting. Crack resistant.

Raspberry – Latham red: Large easy to pick red fruit. Adapts to a wide range of soil and cold hardy.

Grape – Concord blue: Self-pollinating, but benefits from cross-pollination for better yields. Produces large, sweet, blue-purple fruit in late summer to early fall. Cold-hardy and resistant to disease.

- **The District is NOT RESPONSIBLE for plantings once they leave the area after pick-up.**
- Trees are **bare-root stock and sold for conservation purposes only**. Sizes subject to change based on availability from the nursery.
- **No refunds** will be given for orders not picked up. We recommend that early pick up of stock and same day planting will help ensure survivability. If you can't do this, heel the plants immediately into the ground for a short duration. Storing plants in a bucket of water is not recommended.
- **The District will refund orders** for stock that is unavailable and **ONLY IF SUBSTITUTIONS CANNOT BE MADE**.
